Type of Evaluator

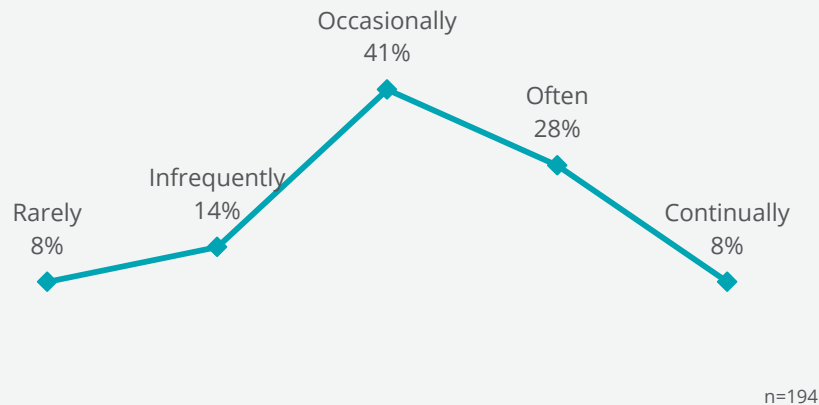
84% of projects had an external evaluator.



19% of grants reported having both an internal and external evaluator.

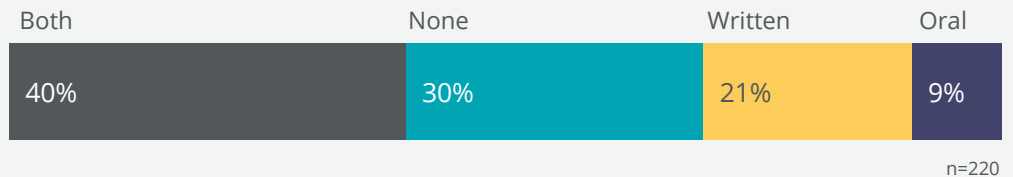
Interaction between Evaluators and Project Leaders

41% of project leaders interacted with their evaluators occasionally (i.e., more often than quarterly and as much as monthly).



Type of Evaluation Report

40% of projects received both written and oral evaluation reports.



Evaluation Use

Project leaders who received reports in **both oral and written** forms reported more use of their evaluation results than those who received just **one type**:
